Engineering

 19 Road Closure for Iron Wheel Development – Continued. 19 Road is closed from Skiff Avenue to Iron Drive and is expected to be closed for another week. This closure is for sanitary sewer installation for the Iron Wheel development. The recommended detour route is taking 19 1/2 Road and Highway 6&50.

Parks and Recreation

- Reed Park Update. The Northern Pavilion construction is completed, and the landscaping should be completed by the end of next week. The electrical pedestals have been installed in the park and the electrician is trying to get everything completed with inspections so we can utilize the new electrical at the Farmer's Market on June 29th. The wheel park continues to progress and is now over 75% complete. The deep bowl has been poured and they are working on the final flat work for the wheelpark. Once completed they will start working on the turndown walls to complete the wheelpark. The center of the park has experienced some delays in grading issues. We hope to have the new plans finalized by the end of the week with the contractor being able to complete the flatwork in the next couple of weeks. The landscaper will start landscaping the entire park now that all irrigation is completed.
- *HeART of Fruita Planters.* The planters are completed, and parks crews will be placing the pedestals, working on irrigation, and planting flowers in preparation for the new art to be placed in September.
- New Program Alert. Youth Fencing Camp wrapped up this week. Olympic style sword fighting or fencing teaches agility and problem solving, all while giving kids a good workout. Camp participants learned basic attack and defense in two fencing styles (Foil and Epee). They also learned basic rules, strategy, and problem-solving skills over the three-day camp. They finished the week with a class tournament.
- **Athletics.** Athletic summer camps are underway with tennis and track and field. Youth Golf clinics at Abode Creek Golf Course are wrapping up for June.
- **Dinomites Summer Camp.** We are three weeks into summer camp! Camp is flying by! There are 50 kids attending Dinomites Summer Camp each week. Last week, campers took a field trip to Get Air, the indoor trampoline park, to cool off from the summer heat.

Public Works

- **Road Maintenance and Overlays Update.** Road Maintenance crew repaired a sink hole on E. Pabor Ave between Peach St. And Elm St., repaired alley on N. Mesa St. and continues with patching and installing thermoplastic crosswalks. The Overlay project began earlier this week with milling of streets. The following streets are scheduled for overlays:
 - Fremont St. From Monument Ridge school to L Road
 - Vermont Dr. From N. Maple to end
 - N. Mulberry/Paulson St. From E. Ottley Ave to Peach Way
 - S. Peach St. From E. Aspen to E. McCune Ave.
 - Heritage Subdivision (Concord, Lexington, Heritage).
- **Utilities Update.** Utilities crew made repairs at Kingsview Lift Station, repaired and installed new head gate paddle wheel cleaners, continue with jetting and CCTV routine work and flushing storm drains downtown.
- Wastewater Reclamation Facility. Wastewater Operator position interviews completed, and the Wastewater Reclamation Facility Superintendent position advertisement closes June 25th. Compliance inspection conducted by the Colorado Department of Public Health & Environment Field Services Section of the Water Quality Control Division was completed at the Wastewater Reclamation Facility. No major findings or other findings were identified.
